Acquisition Information

The reference files of Thurlow Evans Tibbs Jr. documenting African American art and artists were donated to the Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C. in 1996. Following the closing of the Corcoran Gallery in 2007, the Evans-Tibbs Collection arrived at the National Gallery of Art Library, Washington, D.C. in 2015.

Processing History:

The Corcoran Gallery began processing the collection in 1996. Anne H. Simmons continued processing the collection after its arrival at the National Gallery of Art Library in 2015. Collection materials were rehoused by Anna C. Tomlinson, Vada D. Komistra, Anne H. Simmons, and Arlia Delphonse from 2018 through 2019. The finding aid was produced by Vada D. Komistra in 2018 and revised by Arlia Delphonse in 2019 and Anna C. Tomlinson in 2022.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Thurlow Evans Tibbs Jr. (1952-1997) was an art appraiser, broker, collector, and dealer as well as the director of the Evans-Tibbs Collection in Washington, D.C. Tibbs was a Washingtonian, the son of Thurlow Evans Tibbs, an attorney, and Elizabeth (Moore) Tibbs, as well as the grandson of opera singer Annie Lillian Evans Tibbs, also known by her professional name, Madame Lillian Evanti. Tibbs spent his formative years living with his parents, his sister, and his grandmother in Lillian Evanti's childhood home in Shaw, a neighborhood with a longstanding African American history in Northwest Washington.

The residence, a Victorian row house at 1910 Vermont Avenue NW, was built in 1894 by R.E. Crump and purchased by the Evans family in 1904. During the 1920s and 30s – at the height of Lillian Evanti's career – Shaw was home to a community of influential artists and intellectuals, among them W.E.B. Du Bois, Duke Ellington, Langston Hughes, and Alain Locke. The Evans-Tibbs House, as it came to be known, was added to the DC Inventory of Historic Places in 1985 and the National Register of Historic Places in 1987.

After earning a bachelor's degree in the history of art from Dartmouth in 1974 and a master's degree in urban planning from Harvard University in 1976, Tibbs returned to Washington. He resumed residency at 1910 Vermont Avenue NW and worked as a facilities planner for the General Services Administration. Taking a cue from his grandmother, who amassed a significant collection of paintings by African American artists, Tibbs began collecting art and acquired over 600 works throughout the 1970s. He also collected books, brochures, exhibition catalogues, magazines, and newspaper clippings about African American art and artists to accompany the art collection and serve as a small research library. Tibbs was active in the local arts community, and honored Lillian Evanti's legacy by transforming 1910 Vermont Avenue NW into an informal salon and the gallery for the Evans-Tibbs Collection.

The Evans-Tibbs Collection held its first in-house exhibition in 1978. Over the next two decades, Tibbs organized exhibitions featuring both nationally renowned and local African American artists. Tibbs sought to engage the Washington community in the arts by coordinating a calendar of events around each show. *Surrealism and the Afro-American Artist* (1983) was the first widely reviewed and well-received Evans-Tibbs Collection exhibition. The show highlighted Tibbs's ingenuity and revealed his ambition to secure a prominent place for art of the African diaspora within the canon of Western art history. The exhibition featured the paintings of long-established artists such as Hector Hyppolite, Hughie Lee-Smith, and Archibald J. Motley, Jr. alongside works in various mediums by a new generation of artists reshaping Surrealist art, including Gail Shaw Clemons and Yvonne and Curtis Tucker. Equally revolutionary in the 1980s, the Evans-Tibbs Collection held exhibitions exclusively featuring the work of women African American artists. The exhibitions often encompassed a range of styles and media, from the paintings of Margaret Burroughs to the etchings of Sharon Sutton. As one of the early advocates for African American art in Washington, Tibbs worked to create opportunities and fortify a network for the burgeoning community of artists and collectors.

By 1989 the Evans-Tibbs Collection had garnered national recognition. The Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service partnered with the Expansion Arts Program of the National Endowment for the Humanities and the District of Columbia Humanities Council to present *African American Artists 1880-1987: Selections from The Evans-Tibbs Collection*. The exhibition traveled to twenty museums in the United States over three years (1989-1992), and featured the work of fifty-five artists, including Romare Bearden, Elizabeth Catlett, Lois Mailou Jones, Hughie Lee-Smith, Betye Saar, Henry O. Tanner, and James Van Der Zee.

Tibbs left his position with the GSA in 1989 to focus completely on a career in art as an appraiser, broker, and dealer. Tibbs was remarkably successful, forging professional and personal relationships with artists, fellow collectors, libraries, museums, and universities. Principal among them were David C. Driskell, Dr. Harmon and Harriet Kelley, Guy McElroy, Howardena Pindell, the Anacostia Community Museum, the Corcoran Gallery of Art, the DuSable Museum, and Howard University.

Throughout his career, the quality of his work and his expertise made Tibbs a sought-after art professional. Tibbs received numerous letters of introduction, resumes, reference requests, and samples of work from African American artists throughout the United States. Tibbs spent much of his career engaging with the arts community as both consultant and confidant.

In 1996, Tibbs bequeathed thirty-three works of art, including paintings, drawings, photography, mixed media, sculpture, and his reference library, to the Corcoran Gallery of Art. The gift succeeded in preserving the legacy of the Evans and Tibbs families, and ensured part of the Evans-Tibbs Collection would remain permanently in Washington. Upon receiving the gift, the Corcoran Gallery of Art presented Tibbs with the Corcoran Medal of Honor. This prestigious award recognized the donation, as well as Tibbs's dedication and achievements on behalf of African American art and artists spanning

nearly three decades. The following year, Thurlow Evans Tibbs Jr. passed away unexpectedly at the age of forty-four.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Evans-Tibbs Collection contains forty-seven linear feet (84 boxes) of reference materials and correspondence gathered by Thurlow Evans Tibbs, Jr. Brochures, exhibition catalogs, magazine articles, newspaper clippings, posters, and photographs pertaining to the history of African American and African art and artists dating from the early nineteenth century and concluding in 1998. Correspondence covers the business operations of the Evans-Tibbs Collection as well as the professional and personal relationships Tibbs established with artists, galleries, libraries, museums, and universities through his work as an art appraiser, broker, collector, and dealer beginning in 1970 and concluding in 1996. Tibbs also took care to compile articles and newspaper clippings documenting the social history of African Americans and racism in the United States. Subsequent additions were received from the Corcoran staff as well as Tibbs's associates, Kenneth Wyrcht and Francine Farr.

Series I consists of correspondence and ephemera concerning African American and African artists. These files are arranged alphabetically by the surname of the artist. The majority of the letters are addressed to Tibbs regarding appraisals, emerging artists, estate planning, exhibitions, loan agreements, potential acquisitions, and referrals. Exhibition brochures and catalogs, dissertations, magazine and newspaper articles, resumes, and other printed ephemera associated with specific artists are included in each artist file.

Series II contains correspondence and ephemera covering African American and African art in galleries, libraries, museums, and private collections on a global scale. This series consists largely of group exhibition brochures, catalogs, and announcements, as well as institutional correspondence, arranged alphabetically by subject, geographic location, and institution. Magazine and newspaper clippings documenting African American history are also in this series. Files on institutions, such as the DuSable Museum in Chicago, Illinois, include items illustrating their foundation and respective histories. Correspondence and ephemera directly associated with Tibbs and the Evans-Tibbs Collection are also included in this series.

Series III consists of periodicals, photographs, posters, slides and VHS/DVD videos. The photographs and slides primarily document artists and art in the Evans-Tibbs Collection. Audiovisual material includes a documentary biography of Madame Lillian Evanti (Annie Lillian Evans Tibbs), a television news program featuring the Evans-Tibbs Collection, and several features on individual artists. Periodicals in Series III document American racism and African American history in the twentieth century, in addition to the history of art. Posters depict art, exhibitions, and poetry. The Corcoran Medal of Honor presented to Tibbs is also included in this series.

The photographs and slides primarily document artists and art in the Evans-Tibbs Collection. A documentary biography of Madame Lillian Evanti (Annie Lillian Evans Tibbs) and television news programs featuring the Evans-Tibbs Collection are included in VHS and DVD format. Periodicals in Series III document American racism and African American history in the twentieth century, in addition to the history of art. Posters depict art, exhibitions, and poetry. The Corcoran Medal of Honor presented to Tibbs is also included in this series.
